RANK POLICY

Mullen does not calculate class rank. Mullen believes the concept of rank does not accurately reflect the selective nature of our college preparatory curriculum.

SCHEDULE

Mullen has three 60-day trimester grading periods. Students are enrolled in five classes per trimester. Classes are 70 minutes in length and meet five times per week. Each trimester class is 0.5 credits, and students earn up to 7.5 credits per year. This rigorous schedule results in Mullen students meeting a total of 8,400 minutes per year in college-prep and honors classes and 12,600 minutes per year in advanced placement classes.
